October 30, 2025

To acknowledge receipt of the substantive change request. To include the second Master's of Science in Nursing Administration within the institution's scope of accreditation. To require immediate notification when the change is implemented by email to substantivechange@msche.org. To require written evidence of approvals from the United States Department of Education (USDE) and the New York State Department of Education (NYSED). To note that the Commission may rescind this action if the requested substantive change is not implemented within one calendar year from the date of this action. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025-2026.

February 21, 2023

To acknowledge receipt of the substantive change request. To include the first Master's in Healthcare Administration leading to the Master of Science (M.S.) Degree within the institution's scope of accreditation. To note this is a significant departure from existing educational programs. To require written evidence of approvals from all necessary licensing, regulatory, or other legal entities as necessary, including the New York State Education Department. To note the Commission may rescind this action if the requested substantive change is not implemented within one calendar year from the date of this action. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025-2026.

May 24, 2019

To acknowledge receipt of documentation of approval from New York State Education Department.

April 30, 2019

To acknowledge receipt of the substantive change request. To include the second alternative delivery method-distance education program (Bachelor's in Dental Hygiene) within the institution's scope of accreditation. To require written evidence of approvals from New York State Education Department. To note that the Commission may rescind this action if the requested substantive change is not implemented within one calendar year from the date of this action. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025-2026.

August 27, 2018

To acknowledge receipt of the substantive change request and to include the first alternative delivery method program [online Associate in Occupational Studies (AOS) in Court Reporting] within the scope of the institution's accreditation. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025-2026.

November 16, 2017

To accept the progress report. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025 - 2026.

June 22, 2017

To reaffirm accreditation and to request a progress report, due October 1, 2017, documenting the implementation of processes for the evaluation of institutional leadership (Standard 4). The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2025-2026.

March 5, 2015

To note the visit by the Commission's representative and to affirm the relocation of the main campus from 74-09 37th Avenue, Jackson Heights, NY 11372 to 118-33 Queens Boulevard, Forest Hills, NY 11375 within the scope of the institution's accreditation. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2016-2017.

May 22, 2014

To note the institution's decision to relocate the main campus to 118-35 Queens Boulevard, Forest Hills, NY 11375 effective immediately.

April 28, 2014

To acknowledge receipt of the substantive change request. To approve the relocation of the main campus effective September 1, 2014 from 74-09 37th Avenue, Jackson Heights, NY 11372 to 118-35 Queens Boulevard, Forest Hills, NY 11375 and to include provisionally the new campus within the scope of the institution's accreditation pending a site visit within six months of commencing operations. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2016-2017.

March 6, 2014

To accept the progress report. The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2016-2017.

November 15, 2012

To accept the Periodic Review Report and to reaffirm accreditation. To commend the institution for the quality of the Periodic Review Report. To request a progress report, due December 1, 2013, documenting (1) ongoing self-assessment by the governing board (Standard 4); (2) further implementation of a documented assessment process for quantitative reasoning (Standard 12); and (3) steps taken to streamline the reporting of student learning outcomes (Standard 14). The next evaluation visit is scheduled for 2016-2017.

June 28, 2007

To reaffirm accreditation. To request a monitoring report due October 1, 2008 documenting progress in (1) the developing and offering upper level business and liberal arts electives for the new baccalaureate program, and (2) steps taken to strengthen library holdings supporting the new baccalaureate program. To request an additional monitoring report due March 1, 2009 documenting progress in developing additional assessment strategies for the new baccalaureate program and the use of their results. The Periodic Review Report is due June 1, 2012.

The Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) is a global institutional accreditor recognized since 1952 by the United States Secretary of Education.
